for this issue was inspired by the infamous Wizard issue 10 cover. Infamous because it was an unauthorized crossover of a Marvel character and a character from the independent powerhouse of the era, Image comics. Liefeld created



Shaft, and co-created Cable, so he didn't think it was a big deal. Wizard thought it was awesome and ran with it. I would have ran it too, honestly. Marvel however wasn't having it, but unable to recall the magazine, they forbade Wizard from publishing the image for years. Cover retrospectives would only feature a black rectangle where issue 10's cover should have been for nearly a decade. When I started Catalyst, I took wanted to bring back the best of Wiz-ard, and when looking for a way to make issue 10 stand out, an acquaintance suggested commissioning a special piece of art. I then figured I put money into the first issue to make it special, let's commemorate this one the same way. Using The Indieversity Project guidebook, I sought to match a couple indie characters to the two on that Wizard cover. My ideal choices would have been non-white, and non-male, but there is a surprisingly low quantity of archers in the indie sphere—in the book and otherwise. Still, after a couple stumbles, I found our two stars. Ruby and The Quiver Kid, from Kyrun Silva of Taurus Comics and Vince White of DarkLight Studios, respectively. Learning from history however, I did ask for permission. Fish Lee was absolutely the choice out the gate for the artwork because he'd worked with a bunch of the people in the book and he's a quality artist who is very reliable and respected in the scene. And that rep is deserved! Let me tell you folks, he turned this around in about 6 hours time! The man's a monster, and on top of his own book Green Zone (featured in a previous issue of Catalyst), he's drawing many of your favorite indie characters. You can see more of his work in the Gallery of this issue, along with more interviews in more creative media, some new features, and some slight design changes. Additionally, over the next month, the website will be expanding, with tools to support indie creators, so make sure you visit TheCatalyst.digital.

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

Noticing a particular name in my new followers on Instagram, I followed the appropriate links back to the website for Green Pizza Comics and was pleasantly surprised to see the familiar face of

Zach Young

What is Green Pizza Comics, and more specifically what is Sex Life: Zero?

So Green Pizza Comics is just the indie publisher name I created at random to make things legit. I once drew a green pizza doodle years and years ago and I just decided to use it now. Plus I love pizza. I'm still pretty new to all of this stuff and still trying to get a handle on a lot of it but I didn't want to limit myself to making just one comic hence the creation of Green Pizza. Plan is to leave it open for anything else down the line. I also would like to draw my own short comics, I have tons of material but just gotta get back into drawing.



Sex Life: Zero is the series I'm breaking out with. It's a slice-of-life/fantasy, a caricature of real life, self-deprecating humor. Heartbreak, adulting, growing up, getting old, unrequited love, friendship, family, hope...I'm 34 and I wish I could say I've experienced a thousand wars but the truth is that I just have a big imagination. I think there's so much to laugh about the older you get and I wanted to make something relatable. It's sort of an anthology so you can pick it up and read it out of order, but the series focuses on the main character (Vernon Chiu) and his wacky perspective on things like dating. I realize I'm not winning any fans here with this pitch but I just want to cast a line out there to see if anything hits, mainly for the love of creating. If you like "Man Seeking Woman" (TV series adapted from Simon Rich's book) and "Tear Along The Dotted Line" (adult cartoon adapted from Zero Calcare's books) then you might like Sex Life: Zero. These shows do such an incredible job finding the humor in such hopeless experiences.



Now you already have another series that you've been working on, Deep Theory - how is this different?

Deep Theory is a complete 180, the total opposite of Sex Life: Zero. Deep Theory is all about the universe and mysterious phenomena. SLZ is a series of quirky adventures with an average guy. I took life so seriously in my teens and into my twenties that adding humor into my life was the best thing that ever happened to me. I used to philosophize and find wisdom in everything, after a while it gets kind of boring and depressing. So that's sort of how I found comedy to be a comfort, a way to laugh about the things

that are mostly out of my control like the way people behave and how society is. Everything is really sad but if you can make social commentary through comedy then you can spark something in people to hopefully change.

I saw that your first artist on SLZ is a fellow Balkan, Aleksandar Božić SKE, what is it about his art that drew your eye and made you want to work with him?

SKE's work is phenomenal. I found him in the Connecting Comic Book Writers and Artists group on FB and the work he's done is so versatile but it still reeks of his unique style. I'm a sucker for old comic strip styles (expressive line quality, panel design) and I recently found out he prefers the term "cartoonist," so it was meant to be. But his work can be graphic, detailed, comical, dramatic, light-hearted and heart-warming. I was looking for an artist who looked like they knew what they were doing. Luckily Ske had a pretty extensive portfolio and it was a bonus that his illustrations could tell a story on their own. He's professional and he's been an absolute pleasure to work with.



Looking forward, is SLZ the only title that will be under the GPC banner, or will there be other titles?



It would be cool to see more comics. It mainly depends on the stories and ideas. If nothing speaks to me then I don't want to write about it. That's when it becomes a job! But it also depends on funds (how to keep funding the projects) and reception (whether people like it or not). I'd much rather see these stories as TV episodes, it plays out in my head as I write them, and I'm sure you could get some really funny stuff happening when you have other minds (actors and writers) work on it. But funding is a huge thing. So that's partly why I wanted to turn my short

stories into comics is that comics are the perfect medium between film and literature. You can tell a visual story on a budget compared to film where it can cost hundreds of thousands of dollars. Of course, writing is the cheapest way to tell a story, but not a lot of people are willing to pick up a book let alone a short story and invest time into it.

But to answer your question, I'm leaving it open to more titles, but none as of yet. I'm honestly still learning along the way.

Plan is to get this series out for people to read for free. I just want people to enjoy

it first. Then I'll run a Kickstarter in the future to make a trade paperback of the series.

I have to ask, because I'm greedy and I loved the first issue so much, when's Deep Theory issue 2 coming out?

Thanks man that means so much. Wes (IG: wesstclaire) is working hard on it. We've all been hitting some speed bumps in our personal lives but it's getting there. We actually just spoke with him and he's finished with the layouts for the issue. He's inked and colored a handful of pages already and we're just waiting on the next batch before we start rolling out the Kickstarter stuff. You can check out updates (Deep Theory Kickstarter) and previous work on our IG (deeptheorystudios).

Zach had a few things to add about Sex Life:Zero.



Dark Nights

found myself lost, trapped in my feelings.

Physically free to go wherever I wanted but a prisoner in my own mind, no key to the cell I'm locked in. Questioning life, my existence, and everyone else's. Most days, nothing made sense, and when things were comprehended, it was only through destruction and annihilation. I wanted to run, go somewhere, anywhere there was no one else. No other signs of life, I thought about dying more than I lived. The city of hope and elation inside me was established one kind and loving sentiment at a time. I bottled up all of my emotions until they erupted like a volcano. That burned down the city of hope my parents built within me. In the ashes laid joy, happiness, peace, and any other upbeat, positive emotion. I stopped looking forward to tomorrow because it was my tomorrow that took them from me forever. From the ashes arose a loud voice which spoke to me when I was alone and at night.

"Hello, Duante."

"Who are you?"

"I have many names."

"Tell me one."

"Wouldn't you rather know why I'm here?"

"Why are you here?"

"Because you don't want to be here anymore."

"Here?"

"Yes.... yes... you don't want to be amongst the living."

"I don't."

"No, you don't. You no longer care about life. Why should you care? It no longer cares about you, does it?"

"Life doesn't care for me, and I don't care for it."

"You can show life. You can show them all you don't need them."

"You're right. I don't need them."

"Duante, you can end it all, no more pain, no more tomorrows. No one will miss you."

"I can end the pain."

"Yes, what good is your life now, Duante? Give me your life, and in return, I can give you what you desire most-"

"Duante, Duante baby, wake up. You'll be late for school." My grandmother wakes me up daily. I had an alarm clock. It proved useless because the snooze

button became the only good thing in my life. I would wake up to my grandmother sitting at the edge of my bed. I couldn't tell you how or why she could move on every day, but she did. It didn't motivate me to see her doing so well; it did the opposite. I wanted to live less, and less, the more I realized that she never struggled.

My dad would tell me before he would head out to work, "My superpower is I'm fireproof. What's yours?" Then he would hug and kiss me on my forehead. Next, kiss my mother before he left and say, "I'll be home to save you later." My mother's response was always the same, "You're the only one who has an appointment with me." My father would go to work fighting fires and would always come home. He didn't know how not to come back. He was a firefighter before I was born, and after, it was in his blood to help others. I thought he was fireproof. I believed in his superpower because he always came home, and he is my hero.

My mother would come into my room and ask me, "Why is the surgeon faster than the future Hall of Famer?" "Because the surgeon is a morning person," I'd respond. She would smile, pull the covers off the bed, and tell me to get up. She never wanted me to be late; she was so passionate about education. She would often tell me that, "The color of your skin makes you a perceived threat; being educated makes you a legitimate threat, so be justifiably dangerous." She was the granny Matty product. Mom and dad would tell me stories of granny back in the days. I didn't believe a single one. They made her seem like this young gunslinger who took on this country and won. The stories would make me smile, and I would listen to stories about this powerful Black girl, saving the world, or at least her world.

I manage to get myself out of bed, and most days, I would skip breakfast, never really having an appetite in the morning. I'd grab my things, my grandmother would tell me to smile and go live, and then I'd head to school. I missed months of school, just sitting home trying to figure life out. My dad would tell me, "Running is a great way to clear your head. When you run, you're free." I didn't listen to him; I would sit and do little of anything. Nothing brought me joy. I even stopped playing football. I quit the game that I loved. I abruptly put a halt to building things. I had no desire to invent. Even though I was encouraged to do well, school was problematic. Honor Roll was a joke at best. I had surpassed school, I had an interest in learning, but it all went away. Was I lashing out? I did that, as well. I wasn't unreachable; everyone was always within arm's length; I just never reached back. I was standing close enough to see all the hands extended towards me, offering help but just far enough so they couldn't touch me. That was the mantra I'd adopted and started to live by.

I used to meet up with the fellas, but I avoided them because they would always try to make me feel better. It was always me, Angel, Isaiah, and Michael. We grew up together, our families knew each other, and they all supported me in my dark days. It was my dark nights they tried to protect me from. Angel and I were the only ones who had fathers in our homes, Michael never met his dad, but his mother held it down. Isiah's dad was in the army. He died fighting overseas. His mother does it all. Our families are close, so they always check up on me, and they mean well, but this is a different kind of pain. There was this one teacher, Mr. Harris. He was the only black male teacher I had ever had. He would let me sit in class and never disturbed me, an occasional glance and hand on the shoulder, but that was it. His course was always welcoming, and the darkness would disperse

once I got near his class.

I would often hear Mr. Harris say, "Make a note in my file, write me up if you have to. There's more to teaching than the test. These kids are people with lives."

Other teachers would call my house for trivial things, tell my grandmother that I needed help, recommend people I could talk to, say I was a menace, complain there's something wrong with him. Ms. Davis was from the burbs. She walked quickly to work from her car, always seemed scared to be outside the building, and was fearful of this setting. Ms. Davis was consistently attacking me before entering class, I hated life already, and Ms. Davis amplified everything daily. Sometimes, she didn't say a word. It would be looks before I came to class. Ms. Davis would make comments in class about my future or lack thereof. She told me that I needed medication to "fix" me; she would antagonize other students and me into verbal conflicts.

The day I lost it in class, I sat in my seat and didn't take out my notebook or pen. I just sat there, and I don't remember the full conversation, but Ms. Davis blurted out the phrase, "That's why you'll be just like your criminal father." I was shaking in my seat, the rage I felt. Did she even know my father or me for that matter? Did we have a rapport besides knowing each other's names? I held on to the desk as if it was anchoring me down. This kid Jerry for some reason thought it would be a good idea to repeat what Ms. Davis said. I must have blacked out or something. The very next thing I remember was Mr. Harris's arms wrapped around me, Ms. Davis screaming on her cellphone, Jerry lying on the ground, not moving, desk knocked over, and papers everywhere.

Ms. Wagner, the principal, informed my grandmother I'd be removed from the building for a while. My grandmother wasn't done with me. She still had faith. She would stand by my room at night and pray from me, "God, please ease my baby's pain and help him get through these dark nights. Let him know after every storm the sun comes out." I dreamed of a conversation I had with my dad. I remember running home scared with tears in my eyes. I told him I had witnessed a group of kids beat up and rob another. I wanted to help, but I was afraid.

I told him I wasn't like him. I'm not a hero. I don't have what you have inside me. I just froze. He told me there's a hero inside everyone. The circumstance has to be right, or we have to go through something to bring the hero out. When the moment comes, the hero's step up and spring into action. Then came the dad's hug. I used to hate that hug. I woke up from the dream in a cold sweat. It was one of those dreams where it seems real, and you feel it all. I was ten years old, soon to be eleven, wondering how an omnipotent being wasn't available when I needed him. God didn't exist to me anymore. There were no lights for the darkest nights.

The Time Runners series educates youth through literacy by creating engaging historical fiction with characters that look and sound like kids in every American classroom. We expand vocabulary and teach multiple languages while teaching history and introducing people to cultures often left out of books. Students can Learn from the past but also pave the way for a brighter future by focusing on what we can change instead of harping on what we can not.

You're an educator - what are you hoping to teach within the pages of your books?



Students can Learn from the past and pave the way for a brighter future by focusing on what we can change instead of harping on what we can not. Helping expand vocabulary and informing students of the world at large. I hope to teach not just American history but world history through multiple lenses and for students to see the world through the eyes of others. Students can come to their own conclusions about the world as long it's their opinion rather than someone else's. I hope to get students and people, in general, to think and question as much as possible while truly

fact-checking. If the facts prove their original thinking wrong, they are not scared to face the truth, no matter how brutal. I also want to build a community and get back to the days were we had differences but were able to get past them and still get along.

What was your first piece that you felt was ready for public consumption and was it successful?

I felt the free eBook Rise of The Runners was ready after it went to editing. I was right people have loved it, but I was wrong because I was scammed out of so much money by a fake editor. I can laugh about it now because it is hilarious, but I didn't laugh at it when it happened. I wrestled with if I should "Dumb it down" and then decided, hell nah. I don't dumb things down in the class because that's an easy way out. I felt Rise of The Runners was ready because I had to let it go. I was scared to let out. Because I didn't know how it would be received, I realized people would love or hate it. Its art.

I'm a process guy, when you set out to write the first book, did you have the whole story planned out to the end, or did you just follow stream of consciousness?




I had an entire story planned, then it went out the window once i started writing. I stitched it up because the original plan started to expand. I am locked in with planning now because the vision is grand. The plan also changed once I decided to have characters from all over the world speak in their languages. This was insane on my part and recklessly tedious. However, it is worth it when students read in their languages and dialects. They glow with a sense of pride. They feel seen and respected just like they do in my classroom, and that is magic within itself. I have notes and little thoughts all over the place that I had to combine into one document be-

cause I have really great ideas for the story written on random things.

Is there a project that you want to make outside of this series, or even outside of content for education, like just some pure fiction?

I would love to live-action the Rise of the Runners free books like the marvel Disney series. I would also love to do a project on some badass heroes who happen to be teachers. I want to do something original because that's what we are lacking, and I think I could pull it off.



Live action adaptations and more original content, needless to say, I am on board! The Runners universe of books is already expanding though, with The Oneirology Chronicles starting. The Expectancy Vision and Frozen Sands are already in the works!

For those who are not familiar, what is Queendom Come?



Queendom Come is a cross-world/high fantasy series about a young, black woman, Sariya, who is struggling to build the typical American dream life when she soon discovers that she is anything but typical. Her grandmother and a cast of magical characters reveal themselves to be ancient, powerful beings exiled from their world thousands of years ago. They all play parts in guiding and manipulating Sariya as she tries to navigate these two worlds. When she discovers that she is the descendant of royalty and the last remaining key to return them all home, dark forces begin to converge to take her power and her throne.

You are starting with a live action series, no book, no comic - what is it about video that really appeals to you to tell the stories you want to tell?

I'm a filmmaker. I've worked in the industry prior to having my twin boys and have worked independently ever since. I also love the combining of mediums particularly music and film. As a musician, music is a huge inspiration for my writing and filmmaking sometimes even being the way I picture, cultivate and execute a scene. I love the marriage of film, sound, the edit, VFX, and music coming together to create a whole new world (a new fantastic point of view).



I love fantasy books and comics! I read every chance I get. And I love the large amounts of black fantasy and sci-fi I've seen on bookshelves these past three years. We are really in a new renaissance for black art in these genres and I buy everything I can get my hands on. I've been working on this project since my short film in 2017. I wanted to see us in fantasy, particularly epic fantasy. Lord of the Rings was a pivotal book for me. But I wanted something new in the film space that didn't just have us as side characters in a white person's tale. I chose live action because we haven't seen it yet. With so many great voices in the book and comic space, this was something I could give to us.

A big motivating phrase in the video space, especially on YouTube is some variation of "just press record." When you decided to make this, did you sit down and plan out the whole show in fine detail, or just the broad strokes so you can get down to shooting?



I always want to jump in and get on set, but I knew to build something of worth was going to take time. Good epic fantasy ie: Game of Thrones, Lord of the Rings, The Inheritance Trilogy, Avatar the Last Airbender, is all about world building and for me, the best part about fantasy is world building! I'm still building now as I'm writing session 2! But I first needed to understand the story, characters and the world if I was going to stay with them as a series. What was the magic system? Who were the players and what was their past?

I wrote what I wanted to see. A year later and 10 rewrites in, I had something I didn't have the budget for and had no way of getting money of that magnitude. So, I revamped and rewrote creating the beginning of an endless world to explore. One that will hopefully get behind the camera way more often! So yeah, I guess I went into some pretty fine detail.

How has production been coming along? Any roadblocks you had to overcome?

We are currently in post with a release date set for May 11, 2023!! From beginning to end a production is a challenge but a low-no budget production black fantasy show? Roadblocks have been many and almost a daily occurrence since we started in January of 2021. Finding our tribe to make this happen was a huge challenge but throughout this process we have found some lifelong colleges and that alone was worth the hardships. Shooting in LA is also a challenge if you don't have money. All I can say is be kind, bring beer and empty the camera footage before they take the gear! Also, VFX is a beast! A necessity especially on a fantasy show but it has been a huge challenge. Again, finding the right people is 90% of the game.





What is your hope for this show? Are you keeping it independent permanently, or is a network pickup a preferred path?

We're open to any path that will get
Queendom Come to its audience and make it
the best it can be. But our focus is not on Hol-

lywood at the moment. We're highly focused on our audience. My greatest hope is for Queendom Come to find its audience; the only black girl at the ren fair, the blerd in the bookstore, the allies and creatives of all ethnic and cultural backgrounds. I want it to be worlds upon worlds of bipoc content with the audience to back it up!

High goals, and from what I've seen so far, she's absolutely going to reach them. The trailer looks fun, and y'all caught that she's writing season 2 already? I like to hear that, especially in today's market of cancellations. Make sure you subscribe to Rhythm and Noise on YouTube and hit that notification bell so you know when the first episode drops!






Mike did the cover for issue 1 of Catalyst, and this pose really felt like something Sissy would attempt. Go easy on me.

For the uninitiated, what is BOLDSAGA about and why should people be reading it?



BOLDSAGA is an Afrofuturism Manga empowering kings and queens to seize greatness! It follows Masego Umnatha, a meek teen unashamed to follow his dreams, to become the next Anansi like his role model, Shaka Zulu. But first he must overcome tests, trials and a rite of passage that leads to a supernatural encounter where he finds out what ittruly means to be BOLD! People should read BOLDSAGA if they've ever

felt like an underdog. Like life keeps knocking them down, yet they feel it. That burning fire, that voice that wells up from within that screams at the top of it's lungs. You can't stop me, I will win. Doesn't matter how many times I get knocked down, I will win. This is the story of underdogs, RISING!

I will start this by acknowledging that Manga is Comics and that it's not one or the other. My question is why did you choose the Japanese B&W, longer volume format?

Yes I agree, Manga are comics, specifically they began as Japanese Style Comics with their own unique flair and systems. I chose Japanese B&W, longer volume form for a few reasons. Firstly, I grew up on superheroes (Batman, Superman, Spider-Man, etc.) but as I grew older I desired different stories from different cultures. This led me to watching DragonBall Z and then Holding One Piece at Barnes & Noble. From that moment I opened the book I fell in love with the story and I decided, even from back



then, this is something I want to do. Then I spent from that age (about 8) learning and now creating my own manga series. Secondly I prefer manga, the variety is endless. It centers on heroes, culture, power systems, languages, history and many other topics. In addition the black and white style allows you to focus completely on the art and characters, the contrast is magnificent and lack of colors speeds up the production cycle. Thirdly, I love a good long story. My favorite manga is One Piece and I'm inspired by how Eiichiro Oda has created over 1079 chapters of the same story for about 25 years. That just empowers me to create a great, deep, immersive and impactful manga series!



Is BOLDSAGA your first foray into writing, or is there an early gem that die hards should be scraping eBay for, or even another work not related to BOLDSAGA?

BOLDSAGA is my first official manga I released as a mangaka (professional manga artist). My other creations were for my local school newspaper or helping my friends. If you can find it on Ebay, that's impressive!

Who would you say are your biggest influences in comics and why?

My biggest influences in comics are: Osamu Tezuka, Eiichiro Oda and Akira Toriyama. All three revolutionized manga in their own way and left their mark. They told the story they wanted toin a way that was organic, rich and real to them that the reader can just feel and empathize with.



Will this be ongoing until you run out of ideas, or is there a planned ending? If so, what's next after BOLDSAGA?



"Now that," Samuel says as he puts his fork on a licked-clean plate, "Is some damn good apple pie. I'm glad I picked this place."

"What do you mean, picked?" Steve looks up at Samuel at an angle.

"Long explanation short, time works differently where I'm from. For me, I sent the suggestion ten minutes before I walked in. That ten minutes turned into a year of you feeling like this is where you wanted to be at this time."

"Why not just show up where you knew I would already be? I have a home address."

"And you think you would have given me the same chance to explain as you have here today?" Samuel stares at Steve with his eyebrows raised.

"Yea I'd probably have called the cops."

"Exactly. Now where was I? Oh yes, you were arguing with me about solar storage. This will go much faster if you just take me at my word, Steven."

"You'll forgive my skepticism, I'm still wrapping my head around the existence of Jotuns and relativistic time dilation." Steve's brow is furrowed in frustration, but he waves Samuel on.

"Well, as time went on, advancements in technology jumped and lept beyond any previously conceived, including the understanding of space and time. I mentioned FTL, but eventually we even got instant transportation. Organic transportation was limited to plant life and the occasional animal, but it created a pretty significant existential crisis in humanity, so that never really took off. After that became stable though, all it took was a small crew on a light ship to jump to a moon or planet, set up a signal receiver, and they could have a habitable building that was pre-built on any of the already-colonized rocks, with food and oxygen stores preloaded. We went from colonizing Mars in ten years to colonizing Ceres in ten months. That's when the family pooled its resources and claimed the whole of Uranus for storage. Nobody was going to live there anyway, the energy requirements to maintain a livable temperature would have been wasteful. We built an orbital habitat, and by way of a handy dandy elevator system and automation, we used that big gray rock as storage for a good long time. We had just expanded to Neptune around the time when I was born, and right around my fifteenth year, extra-universal space was unlocked. As soon as we cracked that, we moved everything from the various places to what eventually would get named The Armory. A place outside of time and space that stores everything that we'd ever collected, and ever would." Samuel pauses and takes a sip of his coffee. "You've been pretty quiet, Steven."

"Oh I'm just taking it all in. I do have one question."

"Go on."

"Want to break down 'extra-universal space' for me just a bit? Because your brief explanation makes it sound like it's a place outside of - well, existence. Benefit of the doubt or not, that's a hard one to swallow."

"Without getting into the full science of it, I'll try. And that's mostly because science is not my thing, cousin Richard first suggested 'super-existence' as he

called it. Basically when FTL was discovered, it was achieved through a high-speed realm unigraphically in sync with our own. It took a long time to master it - specifically to develop technology to counteract the matter acceleration while also utilizing its benefits. A lot of young explorers came back after a few minutes to live out their golden years, but we eventually got it. While that was all happening, Richard asked if one other state of matter existed, why not a second? And through some testing he found this realm where matter had nearly no progression. No natural movement, noticeable passage of time, or anything of the sort. Essentially whatever went there stayed the same as it was when it left, and returned the same. With the first two probes he thought he'd simply failed to send anything to this realm. A third attempt he left for a week to try and account for time dilation, still no change. The fourth probe he considered an insanely high time dilation and left the probe for a year - only ten minutes had passed on its internal clocks, but no degradation of battery power - nothing. As far as the probe was concerned, it had just recorded the time for ten minutes. That's when he suggested that this realm existed but simply did not have a very active state. It was, for all real intents and purposes, a place of eternal stillness. The infinite darkness at the beginning of many religious texts." Samuel took another sip of his coffee. I think the boy's opening up to this, he notes mentally and continues.

"The fifth excursion he sent a beacon so he could always refer to something. This way he was not sending anything blindly - he wanted to explore the same place - if places existed in this realm. Eventually after a great many drones and so much math it would make your head spin, he figured a precise dilation factor of fifty three thousand and six to one. Up until that point the greatest dilation recorded had been four to one in some parts of the universe. Not counting the FTL space, that is. That ratio was much higher in the other direction, but also had so many other factors to consider. With such a high dilation, you could put the sun there and it wouldn't outgrow Earth's orbit for fifty-three trillion years, instead of the one billion it's projected for. For any practical purposes, it was infinite, endless storage. So we began to build. It took him a few tries to get wearables that would maintain our biological functions - did you know that humans need gravity to function properly?"

"I mean I didn't know, but I would have confidently made that guess."

"It makes sense, of course. Well Richard and his teams - he had many by this point - figured out the transport, the environmental and biological systems - and eventually we started visiting, and the family set out to building a warehouse to end all warehouses. 

Give me your origin story - what got you into comics and into writing?

I realized my passion for writing when I was in the third grade. My teacher at the time would continuously insist that I had, " a way with words", and that really lit a fire within me and made me never want to stop doing it. I guess you say that was my catalyst. The idea that I get to craft these new worlds and create these different personalities to live in them, is something that will never get old for me.



What was the first finished piece that you let people see and how was it received?

The first piece I ever shared was actually a screenplay for a TV pilot. I worked with local actors and conducted a table read...I was extremely nervous but they ended up loving it.

When you started writing Granada's Shadow or RAIN, did you plan out the entire series, or did you just put pen to paper and see where it took you?

Before I start any story/series, I always visualize the entire plot, world and characters before writing anything down. Knowing who my characters are, is a very important part for me, the decisions they would me make, how they speak...etc. Once I feel like I have a good foundation, I allow the visuals in my head to get me excited and motivate me to start the writing process.



When you hit a roadblock in your writing - and let's be honest, we all do - how do you get over it?












NEWHOTNESS



Every issue I ask our featured creators to share some tips & tricks for aspiring creators. If you need some motivation or a fresh outlook, read these gems then get back to work ya slacker!

Paul Darden:

Tip one, write every day, no matter how little, just write. Two, don't be scared to write in your style. With eight billion people on earth, you have an audience that will find ya work.



Three, you will find so much support from random ass people and people who know you might not support at all, and that is ok. Don't hold a grudge. Keep working and get out they to share your work.

Euwarnii Hughes:

You're one idea away. From changing your life. From creating the comic of your dreams. All it takes is just one idea to step into your destiny.

Mediocrity or Excellence. You only have 2 choices as a creator, your fans will realize this too. So make the story you've always wanted to make

GREAT Lastly, Anything is possible. I made BOLDSAGA Ch 1 in the midst of: a mental breakdown, COVID, Losing my grandfather and so many setbacks. So remember, a setback is a setup for a comeback.

So come back, fight for your dreams and K.O. your fears!

Chris L Puckett:

Don't overthink things, it leads to procrastination!

Have mental conversations with your characters. Know them inside and out!

Have fun with it! If you're not enjoying yourself, it'll translate in your writing.



I'm going to throw mine in the mix here. You'll see why when you scroll.

Consistency is more important than intensity. You don't have to write the entire script today. It will take how long it will take.

Learn from losses, but don't dwell on them. Every experience shapes us going forward. You can choose to let a loss keep you

down, or you can use it to propel yourself forward, adapting your approach, now that you know what won't work.

Sometimes enjoying a bit of reward first makes the work go easier. If you were going to get ice cream after you finished the chapter, maybe a piece of candy will motivate you to work so that you can get to that ice cream. Work then reward isn't necessarily the only way to get through it.

So as you see below, Zach had some stuff to say, so I wanted to give him the space to do so.

Zach Young:

From what I've experienced so far, it's a slow-cook process. While those on your team are working hard, there's going to be periods where it seems like forever but just have patience and let them get in their zone. Work on everything you can in the meantime. Promotion, scripts, get better at your craft whether it's art or writing, be creative with engagement and use any resources you have to your advantage, but also...be humane and honest, to yourself and others.



Set your team up for success. Lay the work out, be clear, direct, respectful and communicate as frequently as necessary to avoid any major friction in the future. As I've said before, I overthink a lot of things and overthinking can lead you to places you don't wanna go. Just create, give people what they need and stop being so uptight about stuff. In my head I used to think a lot about how I want things to look and from what angle but if you give too much direction, it leaves the artist no room to be creatively free. You work with an artist because you saw something special in their style, not necessarily because they will do whatever you pay them for, that ain't fun! Even if you did direct all the way down to the nose hairs (unless the story calls for it), it'll never come out exactly how you envisioned it. So lighten up, let people run free. As long as the main points get across, that's all that really matters. That's what collaboration is about.

Prioritize the well-being of others over the project's success. In Deep Theory, I've been working with my best friend since middle school. We grew apart over the years (through high school and college) but we came back together to make Deep Theory. We had some rough patches and tough arguments about the project, but in the end we both agreed that friendship was far more important than creative

direction. It's very much like a marriage, although I'm not married, I do know that both parties have to agree on a fundamental value of prioritizing the relationship and from there you can move in any direction you want. There comes a time when you're given the choice to do the right thing or to chuck everyone out the window for your fame and glory. Don't poop in peoples' cereal. Putting people before projects has been a huge lesson for me.

You're going to write stuff that you will fall in love with and often you'll have to scrap certain parts or rewrite the story entirely, especially if you get an editor and he/she makes very good points. If you know your story through and through and it doesn't hit, don't just listen to your editor, listen to your gut. If it doesn't hit then there's something important missing. If you can't find it, take a break and work on other things while you let it marinate. It'll soak up flavors you didn't think of before and you'll come up with something even better. Then you'll look back and be like whoa that other story kind of sucked. One thing our editor recently brought up to us (me and Vish) is that we will never run out of ideas (because we kept bringing up a new idea in place of one that wasn't working). "Do you want to become better writers or do you want to just put what you have out there?" Of course, we want to become better writers and that takes time, lots of rewriting and hard-decision-making. Doesn't mean putting anything out there isn't worth it. That's essentially another way to become a better writer. So there's a balance. Find a balance that works for you.

Last but not least, Chris Moses spoke about "knowing where you want to go" in the last issue of Catalyst. A hundred percent. Make a plan or don't make a plan but always know where you want to go with it and why you're doing it. Everything else will come. But I've found it much easier to jot down small tasks that I need to do for things such as outreach (finding FB groups, sub reddits, other artists and crowd-funding communities), staying active in those groups, posting progress, being transparent, keeping people engaged in some way—all that stuff helps and it's easier when you can go back to your notebook and check where you left off in posting on FB or IG or reddit, otherwise you may get lost in your own timeline and lose motivation because it becomes this big task and now you have to remember all the things you were going to do. So keeping a list of notes and ideas and things you want to do to get yourself out there can make the journey a lot more enjoyable and leave a lot more room for creation as well. Know where you're going, everything else will come naturally.

Damn.
